

### **Design rationale**

### Community Lane

















#### Green and blue infrastructure

A legible and direct route, with opportunity to pause and dwell and engage with the wider community.

It includes edible planting and pockets of community foraging.

Doorstep playable spaces overlooked by homes and accessed from doorsteps.



#### Movement

Car-free safe route for casual cycling and walking. It threads through neighbourhoods connecting Phase 1 Local Centre and community uses with the formal sports, amenity and allotments to the north of the site.

The Community Lane provides level and traversable access.



#### **Built form**

Buildings define the edges of the route and provide active frontages and passive surveillance to shared spaces.

Moments of compression framing views and creating variety in the shape and conditions of the public realm.






Clear hierarchy of tree planting aids wayfinding. For example including larger trees where transitioning to other spaces such as the Shared Gardens. Fruiting and flowering trees for foraging for people and wildlife, celebrate seasonal change.

Rain gardens respond to the natural fall across the Community Lane, collecting run-off and delineating public to private space.





Doorstep playable space, pockets for community growing and nodes of activity such as groupings of cycle parking, seating and communal entrances to promote incidental social interactions and dwell time.






A shared user path that provides a safe route through neighbourhoods.

A meandering layout keeps movement slow complementing segregated, faster cycling routes.



Where the lane crosses movement corridors that facilitate vehicles, a raised table or change in surface denotes the Community Lane priority.





Thresholds, front doors, habitable rooms and access onto the lane activate the streetscape and engage neighbours. Soft boundary conditions, provide privacy with the ability to connect to the quiet pathway.



Entrances and seating addressing the Community Lane, creating moments for social interaction






Layering of buildings creates moments of compression along the Community Lane.
